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ABOUT INJOT TRUST



Injot Trust is a not-for-profit organization based in Guwahati (Assam, India). Ms. Anjali Tirkey, the founder-director of Injot is a photo essayist, feature writer and philanthropist. Injot's work mainly emphasises on community development, education and advocacy of human rights for the Adivasi population of Assam.

When covid-19 lockdown was imposed all over the country, Injot had started doing relief work in various places of Assam, however, the organisation was officially established on the 9th of August 2020 which is also celebrated as International Day of World's Indigenous people. Injot's allegiance to work for the Adivasi and tea workers' community of Assam, to restore & honour the ancestral wisdom of the indigenous peoples and to work in coexistence with our

past, present and future, The foundation day as 9th August seemed most relevant.

Injot Vision

We visualise a self-reliant Adivasi society with a life of dignity through preservation of ancestral heritage, and social, economic and political empowerment.

Injot Mission

Empower the Adivasi community of Assam to make informed choices for a progressive future through

- interventions for healing of generational trauma,
- an all-rounded educational approach for children, youth and adults.
- and promotion of and training in livelihood alternatives and enterprise.

ABOUT INJOT TRUST

KEY AREAS OF WORK

Injot Education: Injot runs three community learning centres which provides supplementary education and experiential education to underprivileged students especially those, who were left behind in the online education system. Slowly and steadily students are learning to express themselves through art & craft, discovering the joy of books, learning about indigenous seeds and plants and much more. Injot has also started JNV coaching for some of its brighter students under the area of Education.

As a part of Injot Education and advocacy, Injot has initiated a fourmonth mentorship program **Sanghe Urab** for selected 40 youths from the Adivasi and tea garden youth in a hybrid form of online and offline sessions. The mentees are trained by experts from various fields and different parts of country and abroad. It also ran a volunteer led IT skills training program for youths in Kokrajhar. Two youths from the batch were offered training and internship with Pune based company.

For community leaders, **Jameen** - a training and advocacy program on land literacy is organised by Injot Trust as online sessions and offline trainings and conferences.

Shramik program builds awareness on labour laws for the Adivasi and

tea workers' community as online and offline sessions. The offline sessions, though, is often combined with other ally programmes of Injot.

Injot Livelihood: Injot forms linkages for various SHGs and community members for various livelihood schemes and social assistance schemes introduced by the government and facilitates training in livelihood work. Injot hopes to dwell deeper in this area in the coming years

Injot Gender: Injot works with women of the community to create awareness about reproductive and sexual health and rights. Adult education classes for women have also started as part of Injot Gender.

Injot Relief: Injot provides need-based relief in the communities with Injot's presence by networking through various organisation and raising relief-oriented donations.

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SANGHE URAB-INTRODUCTION

Sanghe Urab means "Let's Fly Together" in Sadri language - the lingua franca of Adivasis in Assam. It is a four-phase intervention program to mentor and train educated youth from the Adivasi and the tea workers' community in self-awareness, community development, employability and entrepreneurship.

In the year 2021, Sanghe Urab commenced in the month of July 2021 and concluded in October 2021 at Kohora, Golaghat. In 2022, Sanghe Urab followed the 4 phases of training with minor changes. The first three phases were conducted online and the final phase was conducted as a 5 days and nights residential program in Don Bosco Youth Mission and Educational Services (DBI), Kharghuli, Guwahati, Kamrup (Metro) district. The total number of participants enrolled for the program in 2022 was 40.

Sanghe Urab is a first of its kind program that has created a platform for Adivasi youth to interact with experts and facilitators from diverse professional backgrounds – from senior government officials to social development workers, RTI activists, corporate professionals, entrepreneurs, community mobilisers, conflict management experts, indigenous culture and heritage experts amongst many more.

Sanghe Urab is carefully designed and curated for Adivasi youth interested in self development, and in solving problems faced by marginalised communities, and those who are open to new experiences and learning

PROGRAMME GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Sanghe Urab, wants to give exposure on various topics through expert facilitators to the selected 40 youths each year. We envisage that with this programme, we enable the youths to take pride and find purpose in their existence. The program follows the 3-fold steps of Injot - Heal Educate Empower and through these steps we lead the participants to understand themselves, the community, understand the issues and potential solutions. We educate them about the heritage, the skills and knowledge that help in employment or entrepreneurship. We guide them towards social justice, leadership and various schemes by the government and towards a life vision so that they come about as empowered individuals and changemakers for the society.



THE COHORT OF 2022

THE PARTICIPANTS OF SANGHE URAB 2022 WERE A
DIVERSE MIX DESPITE THE FACT THAT THEY CAME FROM A
SIMILAR HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The youth participants (20 years above) were from different parts of Assam like the districts of Golaghat, Lakhimpur, Sonitpur, Udalguri, Kokrajhar, Dibrugarh, Kamrup Metro, Tinsukia, Baksa and Barpeta and belonging to various fields and diverse backgrounds. They were students, professionals, unemployed youth, NGO workers, community mobilisers, entrepreneurs and civil servant aspirants.







PHASES OF SANGHE URAB

PHASE 1: IDENTITY, EMOTIONS AND COMMUNITY

Phase one of Sanghe Urab was conducted online in the month of July and consisted of 5 online sessions:

Session 1: Titled 'The First Flight' conducted by Injot Core Team - Founder Directror Anjali Tirkey, Trustee Arindita Gogoi and Former Trustee Wilson Hasda, Sanghe Urab started with expectation setting, self portrait, segment on choices and consequences and setting intentions for the program.

Session 2: Titled 'The I and We of Me' conducted by Play for Peace Co-Founders in India - Swati Bhatt and Agyatmitra focused on identity and emotions.

Session 3: Titled 'Dreaming for Me and for Us' was conducted by Anjali Tirkey, the Founder Director and a photoessayist and feature writer. Renowned poet and journalist Jacinta Kerketta shared field stories and her experiences. The session focused on Adivasi movements and collective dreams and goals.

Session 4: Titled 'Of Sounds, Symbols and Stories' conducted by Founder Director of Injot - Anjali Tirkey and Adivasi community leaders Wilfred Topno and Anupchand Minj focused on Adivasi heritage, language and culture and how they shape our individual and collective identity.

Session 5: Titled 'Vulnerability - a Birthplace of Creativity' conducted by experiential educators Ajatshatru and Arindita Gogoi, focused on understanding our emotions and how to transform vulnerable spaces.











PHASES OF SANGHE URAB

PHASE 2: CAREER GOALS & EMPLOYABILITY

Phase two of Sanghe Urab was conducted online in the month of August and consisted of 5 online sessions:

Session 1: Titled 'Youth and conservation-a few insights, career opportunities' was conducted by Dr Sonali Ghosh, IFS, Chief conservator of Forests, Rita Banerji, Founder of Green Hub Project and Founder Director Aniali Tirkey. While the first two facilitators focused on nature and conservation and careers around it. Aniali Tirkev talked about nature and cultural practices of Adivasis as a career/entrepreneurial opportunity. The participants also interacted with Green Hub Fellow Epil Kongari who is also a Global Sustainability Film Awards 2022 Youth Ambassador. and Range Forest Officer Nigar Sultana.

Session 2: Titled 'Career goals and building one's resume' conducted by Injot Team of Founder Anjali Tirkey and Trustee Arindita Gogoi.

Session 3: Titled 'Curating our digital footprint to leverage our career' was conducted by Chandini Varma, Director of Digital Media at PHD UAE and Injot Trustee Arindita Gogoi.

Session 4: Titled 'Skilling and Empowerment: Direct Proportionality' conducted byNabajit Bharali, State Project Manager, Skills and Placement at Assam State Rural Livelihoods Mission, Govt of Assam

Session 5: Titled 'Life Goals, Time Management and Prioritisation' was facilitated by Injot Trustee and educator Arindita Gogoi.

Phase three of Sanghe Urab was conducted online in the month of September and consisted of 2 online sessions that was dedicated to review the various assignments given to the participants.


PHASE 4: 5 DAYS OF RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMME



Phase four of Sanghe Urab 2022 consisted of five days and nights of residential programme organised at Don Bosco Youth Mission and Educational Services (DBI), Kharghuli, Guwahati, Kamrup (Metro) district from the 2nd of October to the 6th. The residential phase saw participants from 2022, alumni of 2021, volunteer participants from Injot Team and thirteen facilitators from Assam and other states of India.

DAY ONE

TRADITIONAL WELCOME, REGISTRATION, INTRODUCTION & MORE

On the 2nd of October 2022, participants of Sanghe Urab 2022, a couple of alumni from 2021 and the volunteers from Injot team reached the venue of Don Bosco Youth Mission and Educational Services (DBI), Kharghuli, Guwahati, Kamrup (Metro). They were welcomed with Adivasi rituals of washing the hands and anointing with water and were given a program kit after the registration and room assignment.

The Founder Director of Injot Trust, Anjali Tirkey welcomed the participants and Trustee Arindita Gogoi introduced the organisation and mentioned the support of State Bank of India as the principal sponsor and Oil India Limited as co-sponsor.

A session on diversity, stereotypes, prejudices, inclusion, equity and social justice was conducted by Anjali Tirkey allowing the participants to understand and marvel at the diversity within them and identify the commonalities too and be inclusive in action.

DAY ONE







The session was followed by an ice breaker game through which by Swati Bhatt and Agyatmitra, the cofounders of Play for Peace organisation created an opportunity for the participants to introduce themselves to each other. The day was spent in creating norms and expectations for the program. Participants displayed their intention flags and learnt the expression of gratitude.

DAY TWO

SESSIONS, ACTIVITIES, LISTENING TO STORIES, REFLECTIONS & MORE

The day started with an energizer and then Mr. Anupchand Minj, lawyer and RTI expert conducted a session on Understanding RTI Act 2005 and it's worth as powerful tool for information, transparency and accountability. The participants practiced writing applications under RTI on issues that concerned them.

Dr. JB Ekka IAS, Principal Secretary, Government of Assam conducted a session on the second day. "Don't wait for the perfect conditions - start with what you have in hand and keep building on it. When you arrive at one goal, it does not mean it is the end - it only means you have to work hard and maintain that excellence, till you arrive at the next pit stop," he advised the participants citing his own journey from a typical Adivasi home, to MBBS in AIIMS, New Delhi, his IAS journey followed by his Masters in Public Health from Johns Hopkins University,

DAY TWO





The sessions were followed by an activity led by experiential educator and Injot Trustee, Arindita Gogoi and Play for Peace co-founders, Swati Bhatt and Agyatmitra during which the participants created zines (mini-magazines) describing their identity and journey so far in Sanghe Urab. Such explorations of emotions and creativity gave an opportunity to participants to delve deep into their selves and look for an individual as well as collective vision.

Founder Director, photo-essayist and the lead catalyst of Sanghe Urab, Anjali Tirkey took a session on land and Adivasis. She shared with the participants the value and worth of land for an Adivasi who has not just a socio-economic relationship with land but his/her spiritual belief, identity and existence and survival is based on land. She talked about the various policies and the issues of land alienation and potential solutions.

The evening was spent listening to stories of Adivasi heroes and sheroes - an assignment given to the participants during the Phase one of program to research and document lives of legends of national and international stature and also of the unknown heroes living in our neighbourhood and working tirelessly to bring a change in the Adivasi society.

DAY THREE



CULTURE & LANGUAGE, LAND LITERACY, PLAY FOR PEACE & REVIEW

Day 3 started with the beat of drums and rhythm of steps dancing with the melody of Adivasi songs. Mr. Wilfred Topno, President of Adivasi Sahitya Sabha and Director of Peoples' Action for Development, took the session on Adivasi culture and languages and how language is the treasure trove of our history, belief system and identity. In Phase 1 of Sanghe Urab, the importance of tribal languages and practice of traditional festivals, their ecological significance was given emphasis by Anjali Tirkey. The session filled the participants with pride for the ancestral knowledge.

The session with Mr. Nazrul Islam IAS (Retd.), an expert par excellence on land matters and consultant to the Govt. of Assam on land literacy covering the topics of land vocabulary, procedures, land laws, Right to Public Services and Integrated Land Records Management System laid the foundation to exploring solutions for the grave issue of land alienation among the Adivasi community.

DAY THREE





The participants were also able to meet and interact with community leaders working in the field on land issues under the guidance of Mr. Islam, IAS (Retd.) under the flagship programme Jameen- an advocacy and training initiative by Injot Trust on land literacy. The interactions were motivating for everyone.

Play of Peace sessions conducted by Agyatmitra, Swati Bhatt and Arindita Gogoi rewired the minds of the participants and guided them towards leadership skills, risk taking and creativity. The participants composed songs of various genre like rap music which proclaimed the struggles and strengths of the community from their collective living experiences.

The facilitators also joined Injot Founder Director and Trustee, Anjali Tirkey and Arindita Gogoi in reviewing the various assignments given to the participants during the online phases especially the resume building.

DAY FOUR





The day started with Dr. J B Ekka, IAS Principal Secretary, Govt of Assam providing the participant an understanding of various universal schemes and social assistances and entitlements and citizens right to public services. His session covered the schemes implemented by different Departments of the Government which can be availed by the community.

This was followed by a session on skills and livelihood and their direct impact on the employment and empowerment of the community by Mr. Nabajit Bharali, State Project Manager, Skills & Placement, ASRLM. He highlighted the problems of unemployment and informed the participants about the various skill training schemes being implemented by the Assam Govt. which are all free of costs. He hoped the participants would avail the opportunity and share these information with 10 more who will further share with others and thus help in creating an informed community.

The session of Play for Peace again created a non-competitive and non-judgmental space to reflect and practice the learning of the day.

DAY FIVE

ADIVASI HERITAGE, CONSERVATION AS CAREER OPPORTUNITIES, LEADING & LEARNING, CLOSING REFLECTIONS AND CULTURAL EVENING

Dr. Hippoletus Toppo, Principal Don Bosco School, Rowta and scholar and writer of few books on Adivasi festivals and folklores started the morning session introducing the participants to the Adivasi heritage of music and songs, festivals and the ecological connections, the ancestral religion and lifestyle of co-existence and respect for each element of nature and how they stand true in the present and in many ways is the need of the hour when the fabric of society and the climate is at threat.

His session flowed into a highly engaging time with Dr. Sonali Ghosh IFS, Chief Conservator of Assam, She talked about Youth and conservation in which she focused on how young people can take up conservation and nature centric careers and they may come more easily to Adivasi youth as the community has strong knowledge of local biodiversity. The participants shared their experiences of the wild and it was obvious that many had good knowledge about Assam's flora and fauna.

DAY FIVE





Ms. Keethi Jalli IAS, Deputy Commissioner of Kamrup Rural district, had an interactive session with the participants revolving around the topic of Leading and Learning. The activity, that involved loud music, dancing and at the same time learning something from the other in a limited time, allowed the participants to realise that life can be a chaos often and yet there can be learning and multitasking. She gave examples from her personal life also and shared how she has overcome her own fears and tried to do the best and how she is always open to learning. Many of the participants who had seen her videos and read about her exemplary work during flood in Cachar district were thrilled to meet her.













DAY FIVE







The sessions ended with experiential educator and trustee Arindita Gogoi and Play for Peace practitioner Agyatmitra guiding the particiapnts through closing reflections on the learning and experiences and memories the participants had gathered during Sanghe Urab. The participants were encouraged to reaffirm their commitments towards themselves.

Though during the program, some of the participants and facilitators fell ill and a few left for their homes, the spirit of learning never got subdued. The Founder Director, Ms. Anjali Tirkey, took care with medicines and brought home-cooked food as per the needs of the sick each day.

CULTURAL EVENING AND CLOSING

The last evening was the time where the participants were asked to take the lead and plan the evening. Dressed in traditional fineries, the participants welcomed the facilitators according to the traditional Adivasi practices. They curated a cultural program which had songs in the mother-tongues of participants, dances that belonged to their tribes and dances that also were based on modern dancing. It was an evening where all proclaimed through the dancing their a new found respect for cultural roots, heritage and ancestral wisdom; every dance step an affirmation of hope and a united and progressive Adivasi society.

It was an evening dedicated to the 4 months of journey and friendship made and the sound of the mandar reverberated the feeling late till dinner time and later.

THE IMPACT

Sanghe Urab 2022 made a deep impact on the participants. We sincerely believe that the participants who learnt from the best of the facilitators in their respective fields will exercise the learnings in their life and create a ripple effect. Thus the outcome of the program is not limited to the Cohort of 40, but will have far reaching impact in the community as these participants influence mobilisation at the grassroot level.

From the experience of the first year of Sanghe Urab in 2021, we have realised that the participants had an enriching experience which they carried back to the community. Every participant mentioned about being more aware and self-assured. Some of the participants started a good career as they found themselves more knowledgeable and confident during their job interviews, 2 of the participants started free coaching class for the student in the tea gardens around their homes, many of the participants helped the community by helping in the registration for e-Shram, a few helped in applying for land documents through Mission Basundhara, 3 of the participants filed RTI related to issues that concerned them like, PDS system in their area, health situation in the tea gardens and few helped the students from the Adivasi and tea garden community to apply for Sirish scholarship under Tea Tribes Welfare Dept, Govt. of Assam. Those who were already working in NGOs or had other jobs became more effective in their performance.

'Sanghe Urab'- Injot's Program for Adivasi Youth Kicks Off in Guwahati

Sanghe Urab's residential phase kicked off at Don Bosco Youth Mission and Educational Services (DBI) in Guwahati on October 2.





GUWAHATI: "I don't think Adivasis are only successful because of reservations, and that we are not intellectual. Adivasi wisdom has been passed on from generations. Our traditional architecture is sustainable and exhibits thermal insulation along with aesthetics in the form of wall arts. I see women of our community as master architects and engineers. There is so much intellect in the community, then how can people only say our success is only based on reservations?", said youth participant John Kandulna, at Sanghe Urab 2022.

The mentorship program is supported by State Bank of India as the Principal Sponsor. They supported the same program last year in 2021 where the residential phase was organised in Kaziranga, hoping to open possibilities for the Adivasi youth. Oil India Limited too has been a co-sponsor of Sanghe Urab.

"Sanghe Urab is not about hand-holding our Adivasi youth or to patronise them into choosing what we think is good for them, but to empower them to make informed choices for themselves and the community. We provide a bit of scaffolding for their journey of self-discovery by providing them with tools and exposures to diverse people and fields, that they can use to design a progressive path for themselves. We would love it if some of these youth decide to do something for the community and become active change makers, but we will be satisfied if they become successful and happy individuals, and live a life which inspires others," said Ms. Anjali

Sanghe Urab's residential phase kicked off at Don Bosco Youth Mission and Educational Services (DBI) in Guwahati on October 2. It is one of the first of its kind mentorship program specially designed for Adivasi youth of Assam during which participants experience a wide range of interactive sessions facilitated by experts from diverse fields - from IAS officers to Play for Peace practitioners, entrepreneurs and politicians to social development professionals, activists and journalists to educators, photo-essayists, authors and people from the corporate world.

Sanghe Urab means 'Let's Fly Together' in Sadri language - the lingua franca of Adivasis in Assam. Injot designed this program using its three-fold approach of Heal, Educate, Empower Some parts of the program are designed for the participants to access the emotions within them and to identify the needs that generate those emotions. At the same time, the participants explore how all these impact their behaviour and in turn become a part of their identity. A considerable part of the program focuses on the Adivasi identity of the participants and introduces them to the rich indigenous heritage, Adivasi movements and ancestral wisdom - at the heart of which is sustainability and co-existence with the natural world.

The residential part is the fourth phase of Sanghe Urab 2022. In the first three phases the participants took part in 12 online sessions which were designed around the themes of emotions, identity and community, Adivasi culture and heritage, and career goals and employability. In the fourth phase they will be introduced to the panorama of social justice, community building, leadership, enterprise and life vision.

Some participants reflected upon how they navigated an activity during a Play for Peace session. "During the activity I made sure that I spoke out what I wanted to in the beginning so that I don't feel like I did not speak my mind. At the same time, I figured that it is okay to follow other ideas that are better," said Junali Baskey - a young participant.

Injot founders Anjali Tirkey and Arindita Gogoi believe that this program will go on to build a strong community of Adiwasi youth in Assam who can think critically, are more confident in their interactions with others and most importantly those who are reconnected to the Adiwasi heritage and culture, and to the depth of Adivasi wisdom. The next four days of the residential phase, according to them, are going to be a thrilling yet grounding ride, for not just the participants but to all facilitators as well.

During the review of one of the assignments given during the online phase of Sanghe Urab on documenting the Adivasi heroes and sheroes whose exemplary contributions should be of national stature and also the unknown heroes who live in our amidst, often unacknowledged and yet silently contributing towards the betterment of the society, Asranti Bhengra felt that while doing the assignments, she discovered many Adivasi legends about whom she hardly knew before and she understood the value of documenting the life stories of those whose contribution and roles are unheard of.

Facilitators and speakers that the participants are about to meet in the next few days are Dr. JB Ekka IAS, Principal Secretary, Government of Assam, Anupchand Mini - lawver and RTI expert. Wilfred Topno - Director of PAD and Founder of Adivasi Mahasabha, Agyat Mitra and Swati Bhatt - Play for Peace practitioners, Mr. Nazrul Islam IAS (Retd.) - expert par excellence on land matters in Assam, Keerthi Jhalli IAS, DC, Kamrup Rural, Dr. Sonali Ghosh IFS, Chief Conservator of Forests, Assam, Dr. Hippoletus Toppo - scholar and expert on Adivasi culture and heritage, Runa Rafique - farmer and livestock entrepreneur, Nabajit Bharali - State Project Manager, Skills and Placement at ASRLM, Government of Assam, and Bikram Kairi IAS - the first IAS officer from Barak valley.

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When You Learn to Fly Together: Sanghe Urab 2022

Injot's Sanghe Urab 2022 - the four month journey of a unique mentorship program for Adivasi youth of Assam concludes in Guwahati.





GUWAHATI: As Santosh Topno, a youth participant in SangheUrab tapped his fingers on the maandar and KunjalTopno - another peer melodiously sang a few lines in Mundari, the energy of the room changed. It was evident that there was more to the community dance that day - something beyond fun. It felt as if the participants and facilitators were dancing together in proclamation of a new found respect for their culture, heritage and ancestral wisdom; every dance step an affirmation of hope and a united Adivasi society.

Sanghe Urab is a unique mentorship program - a first of its kind in Assam for Adivasi youth of the region conceptualised and organised by Guwahati based non-profit Injot Trust. The program is a hybrid of online and offline sessions during which mentors from diverse fields introduce the participants to various aspects of self, community, profession and social justice, over a period of three to four months. The principal sponsor of the residential program is State Bank of India which had also supported the program in 2021. The co-sponsor of the residential program is Oil India Limited.

A crucial segment of the Sanghe Urab program is focused on the Adivasi identity - the ancestral wisdom, the culture, the heritage, the stories rituals and sustainable practices deeply rooted in human's co-existence in nature as an integral member of the ecosystem (and not as a controlle of the system). Injot's Founder Director introduced the participants to the diverse mural arts, tattoo art and stories. "In Assam, there is a tendency to paint every Adivasi with the same brush stroke - it eliminates the diversity that exists in the Adivasi society. Even our youth in Assan have been through the same education system historic oppression and systemic obliteration of heterogeneity. I was not surprised to see that many of our participants did not know about the richness and diversity, and I do not blame them For generations they have been made to feel like lesser inhabitants of this state. But I think it is time for reclamation of the Adivasi identity and feeling self-assured about it," said Anjali Tirkey Founder Director of Injot Trust

Ms. Tirkey also shared about the importance of preserving Adivasi languages and introduced the participants to various Adivasi movements from Koel Karo to Netarhat to Niyamgiri and to people whose contribution often remain unrecognised by the mainstream. Through an assignment, she instructed participants to investigate and research about other Adivasi heroes and sheroes, and also give presentations on Adivasi people from their own villages and towns, whom they considered to be heroes and sheroes irrespective of whether

they are famous. A good chunk of an evening during the residential session was spent in listening to the stories collected by the participants. Asranti Bhengra - a participant said. "When the assignment was given, I did not really understand the value of the exercise. But now that I am listening to these multitude of stories from all my peers, I am not just filled with pride, but also, I am getting the yearning to do more indepth research. If not us, who else will narrate these stories?"

Jacinta Kerketta - renowned journalist and poetess along with Founder Director, during an online session shared her knowledge and experiences from the fields about the Adivas movements with examples abound, Dr.Hippoletus Toppo - scholar and Adivasi cultural expert conducted a meaningful session with the participants on Adivasi culture that prompted them to reflect on cultural practices that are disappearing and are in need of preservation While youth participant Johny Kandulna expressed his intention to document indigenous medicinal practices, other participants made an intention to reconnect with nature and truly practise the concept of "nature is an Adivasi's temple". Wilfred Topno - Director of People's Action for Development (PAD) reconnected the youth to Adivasi music and dance, and spok about Adivasi languages and their origin. Injot Trust also invited senior governmen

officials, who introduced the participants to the government machinery and also took questions to clear their doubts. Dr. JB Ekka IAS, Principal Secretary, Government of Assam spent a great deal of time with the participants and conducted two sessions during the residential program. "Don't wait for the perfect conditions - start with what you have in hand and keep building on it. When you arrive at one goal, it does not mean it is the end - it only means you have to work hard and maintain that excellence, till you arrive at the next pit stop," he advised the participants citing his own journey of humble beginnings, then doing MBBS in AIIMS, New Delhi, his IAS journey followed by his Masters in Public Health from Johns Hopkins University, USA. He also introduced to the participants various universa schemes under the Govt. of Assam and Govt. of India that could help the community and encouraged them to build awareness in their towns, villages, districts so that more people can avail the benefits of these schemes

Keerthi Jalli IAS, DC of Kamrup (Rural) also spent time with the participants and conducted a highly interactive session 'Leadership and Learning'. Her session focussed on the idea of how to learn and stay open to learning. 'Do not feel shy about asking what you want to know. Do not feel hesitant to take charge of your own learning. Seize the moment of learning - the smallest window to observe someone, speak to someone, or do something. Don't let it go away because you did not realise that you could learn something from that moment or that person," she encouraged the participants.

Another important segment of Sanghe Urab was the panorama of social justice. It started with Injot's Founder Director sharing how not being empowered to distinguish between facts and opinions - lack of critical thinking, can lead to stereotypes and prejudices and thus create a divisive society. She also spoke about concepts

of inclusion, equity and equality and their interconnectedness with social justice. Anupchand Minj - lawyer and RTI Expert conducted a session on RTI Act and how it can help in getting accurate information from the government, and how it can be a powerful tool to build accountability. Nazrul Islam IAS (Retd.) conducted a session on Land Literacy and introduced the youth to the basic vocabulary and system of land matters. During the same session the vouth participants got a chance to meet

participants of Injot's Jameen - a training and advocacy program on land literacy, who are working actively to implement the learnings from the program to the Adivasi community at the grassroots.

Sanghe Urab also focused on career and employability. Sessions on career design and resume building were conducted by Trustee of Injot Trust Arindita Gogoi and Anjali Tirkey -Founder Director. An online session on Understanding Digital Footprint was conducted by Dubai based digital marketing expert Chandni Varma. Along the lines of employability and entrepreneurship, a powerful session was conducted by Runa Rafique - a farmer and livestock entrepreneur. She encouraged the participants who were interested in enterprise to study the market, understand people's needs and create business plans accordingly. She also offered to provide further mentorship to those who want to get into livestock farming. A highly engaging session was conducted by Dr. Sonali Ghosh IFS, Chief Conservator of Assam, in which she focused on how young people can take up conservation and nature centric careers and they may come more easily to Adivasi youth as the community has strong knowledge of local biodiversity. Rita Banerjee, Founder of the Green Hub Project during her online session had shared how young people can work on conservation and social change through the digital medium. EM Wilson Hasda, in his online session shared about his life and motivated the youth to work smart and hard for their chosen goals. For many of the participants he is a hero as they could identify with his life and struggles. NabajitBharali, State Project Manager, Skills & Placement at Assam State Rural Livelihoods Mission, Govt of Assam conducted an interesting and informative session on skills training offered by the government of Assam and how the youth can benefit from such programs. JohnyKandulna who has been documenting the Adivasi traditional medicines felt re-energised to continue his work with fervour

The social emotional learning aspect of the program was facilitated through experiential sessions that are based on Play for Peace values of inclusion, safety, fun and cooperation, principles of Nonviolent Communication (NVC) and the Creative Community model. Cooperative games and expressive arts were extensively used to create a safe space for conversations. discussions and reflection, and most importantly stringing together the learnings from the journey of four months. Play for Peace practitioners Agyatmitra, Swati Bhatt and Ajatshatru, and Injot Trustee Arindita Gogoi facilitated these sessio during the online as well as residential program. Millika Topno- a participant said, "I did not realise when my stretch zone became a comfort zone in the past few days. I am learning so much about myself that it is a wonder.'

The five-day residential program concluded with a cultural show organised by the participants amidst laughter, dance, music and felicitations. "Darkness cannot eliminate darkness. Only Injot (illumination) can. Thanks to Injot Trust, we are learning to fly together through Sanghe Urab," concludes participant James Maximillianer Swansi.

Unjust treatment of anyone, especially against marginalised people always disturbed him. He found the RTI Act 2005 to be a powerful tool for ordinary citizens and became an RTI crusader. He has filed hundreds of RTIs till date and feels the applications make government departments more alert and accountable. He has been associated with Injot's various programs like Jameen and Sanghe Urab.

From being a television scriptwriter and a site-engineer, Agyat moved to the field of experiential learning and has been practicing Play for Peace methodologies for conflict resolution and peace-building for 21 years. Prior to venturing into farmpreneurship, she has worked extensively in the development sector and government programmes.

KEERTHI JALLI IAS

She is a 2013 batch, Assam cadre IAS officer who has served as Deputy Commissioner in Aspirational District of Hailakandi and Cachar district before being posted as DC Kamrup (Rural). Her exemplary work as an administrator has earned her many National awards. The voung officer has made waves in social media and won the hearts of youth and all for her videos which showed her toiling hard and reaching out to the flood affected people of Cachar. A Computer Science Engineer by education, Ms. Keerthi likes to challenge her mind and body by pursuing adventure activities which often are considered "undoable". Be it challenging her Hyderabadi-ness with the biting cold of River Zanskar on Chadar Trek in the winters of Ladakh, or learning to ride a bullet to explore the beauty of Kashmir, or the way she skirts risk with bullets on the borders of Mizoram. She believes in nudging girls out of their comfort zone to chisel the innate leader within.


